## Year 6 SATs

Congratulations to the staff and our Year 6 children on their impressive KS2 SAT results. We are extremely proud of the hard work, dedication and resilience that they have shown this year. The percentages of children meeting the expected standards are as follows:

Reading 81% (national average is 73%)

Writing 88% (national 78%)

Maths 69% (national 79%)

Combined Reading, Writing & Maths 69% (national 65%)

With our small cohort size, each child represents 6.3%, so our figures can fluctuate year by year as a result. Two more children achieving the expected standard in Maths would therefore have taken our percentage to 82%.

The Year 6 children should be rightly proud of the progress that they have made throughout the school to achieve the results that each individual has. The results do not define our children and are a stepping stone on to the next stage of their academic journey. In addition to these results, they have achieved and developed so much as individuals too, and we are all very proud of each and everyone of them for this. We wish the children every success in the future—you will all be missed—and thank you to parents for all your support over the years at St. Mary's.

## Staffing

The final few weeks have been an emotional time in saying farewell to Mrs Nina Read who moves to a new post in September. We held a special leaving assembly for her this week and presented her with several gifts from the children and staff. Mrs Read's positivity, enthusiasm, dedication, hard work and creativity will be sorely missed by all of us here at St. Mary's, however we wish her much happiness in her retirement. Next year I will be teaching Class 2 on a Friday and am looking forward to it very much!

We also say farewell to Mrs Mandy Newby who has worked one day a week in Class 4 for the last three years. Her sense of humour, flexibility and creativity will be missed. Mrs Kate Waugh, who is a qualified teacher, will be leading Class 4 on Wednesday mornings, with Total Sport leading in the afternoon.

Our pupil attendance figure for the school year is a very impressive 96.4%. This is above our school target of 96%, so thank you to all our children and parents for achieving this figure, for which we should be rightly proud. Every day spent in school increases

chances of improved outcomes for children. There were 47 children who had full attendance this term and 10 children who achieved our Attendance Star Award for full attendance for the whole school year—a very impressive feat indeed!
